PREFACE

This Tape Support Material Booklet accospanies Tapes 2301C-2310C, to be used with Voluee 2300 of the American Language Course (ALC). This tape support material provides for active atudent participation in the language laboratory.

The ALC materials consist of the Pre-Elementary Phase; the Elementary Phase; the Intermediate Phase; the Advanced Phase; and the Specialised Phase, in which students concentrate on the technical vocabulary of one of several military specialties such as flying, ordnance, electronics, etc. Most volumes of the Arerican Language Course are accompanied by similarly numbered prerecorded tapes which provide aural-oral and written oxercises coordinated with the contents of the volumes. Special student texts and workbooks, instructor texts, tests, and other materials have also been prepared for use with these volumes.

The American Language Course is designed for an intensive language training program to provide students who do not understand and speak English with sufficient sill in English to enable them to pursue technical or professional training in various schools sponsored by the Depprtent of Defense of the United States of Aberica.

The American Language Course is published by the Defense Language Institute, English Language Center. This publication is for use by schools of the Defense Language Institute as part of the Defense Language Progran. It is also for use by schools under technical control of the Defense Language Institute.
